




Abstract

Another edition of Sudety Cup is ahead of us and this time we return to where it all began – Lasówka. It was in these forests that the idea for the event was born, an event that each year attracts more and more people seeking genuine contact with nature and a peaceful, welcoming atmosphere. This year's edition once again takes you deep into the heart of Sudety wilderness – from the marshy, almost flat plain around Siwa Skała, through the route-choiceheavy slopes of Góra Kłobuk, to the mosaic landscape of

Mostowy Potok and the valley of Dzika Orlica where water, undergrowth and terrain details will test your focus and precision. Each stage has its own character, yet all share the same goal: quality - carefully crafted maps, thoughtful course setting and a unique atmosphere. We invite you to take part and rediscover the Sudety step by step, control by control. See you in Lasówka!







Event rank

4-stage individual national ranking event, KM21E classes with WRE status during 3rd stage.



First stage takes you into the **mystical Sudety plain** – an almost flat yet surprisingly demanding area where every step can change the rhythm of your race. A dense network of ditches and marshy depressions will dictate its own cadence, while the shifting vegetation – from fast, white forest to thickets and overgrown rides – will require constant focus. In a landscape with almost no contour detail, the compass will become your most reliable ally as you navigate around the majestic Siwa Skała.

Stage two takes you into a **land of demanding route choices** where the mountain character of the terrain requires full focus from the very first meters. Around the summit of Góra Kłobuk, you will encounter tightly packed contour lines and the deep valley with its stream will play a key role in shaping many route options. Variable runnability – from open forest to green thickets and overgrown strips – will limit visibility and slow your movement. As in any long distance, success will depend on calm, strategic route-choice decisions.





Third stage leads you through a **mosaic of subtle challenges** where moderately undulating terrain hides numerous watercourses along the valley of the Mostowy Potok. The shifting vegetation – fast forest mixed with thickets and small clearings – will significantly limit visibility and require frequent map contact. Marshy areas will become natural barriers while numerous point features will serve as valuable navigational anchors. This stage is part of the World Ranking Event (WRE), so precision and smooth navigation will be especially important.

The final stage takes you into a landscape of valleys and wetlands where distinct relief and the dominant main valley will require repeated elevation changes. Runnability will shift from open forest to dense undergrowth and green strips that slow you down. The main challenge will be the marshy valley of Dzika Orlica where ditches and the central stream can easily disrupt your plans and block simple shortcuts. It is a demanding finale in which victory goes to those who can read the terrain as well as the map.





Location

The Event Center and the finish of all four stages will be located in the picturesque village of Lasówka, right next to the Polish-Czech border, in a peaceful valley surrounded by the vast forests of the Orlickie and Bystrzyckie Mountains. The atmosphere of Lasówka - with its mountain character and close connection to wild nature - will create a unique setting for the entire event and allow participants to fully focus on top-level competition.

Kid's zone

There will be Kid's zone with attractions for the youngest organized at each stage at the Event Center. Also, a special Mini-O course for children located next to the Event Center will be available. Both Kid's zone and Mini-O will be free of charge and available to all willing children without prior registration.

Parking

During the event, we provide free car parking located in the immediate vicinity of the Event Center.

Cafeteria

There will be a cafeteria during each stage at the Event Center. Simple barbecue dishes, snacks and drinks will be offered.

Sudety Camp

As in previous editions, we are planning to open Sudety Camp, a tent area and campervans zone located directly next to the Event Center. Full details, along with the reservation form, will be published within the next few weeks.

It is possible to modify your entry details free of charge (including its cancellation) until **20.07.2026**. In case of entry cancellation after 20.07.2026 we do not provide any refund.

Enka	1,5-2,0 km	easy	marked course for children (individual participants)
Krótka	2,0-3,0 km	easy	easy course for beginners who do not need marked course
Średnia	3,0-4,0 km	medium	for those who already have some orienteering experience
Challenge	2,5-3,5 km	difficult	short but technically demanding course for challengers
Ultra	3,0-5,0 km	difficult	technically demanding course for fans of orienteering adventures

There is no start time assignment for open classes, you can start at any time during two hours and thirty minutes of the start time (00-150').

The validity of the entry within a given deadline is determined by entry fee payment to the organizer's account, not by the fact of just registering an entry via entry system.

Model Event

The day before Stage 1, we invite you to the official Model Event which will take place between 15:00-18:00 on a new map located directly adjacent to the event area. Two courses will be available: Challenge - 3 km or Ultra - 4 km. SPORTident will be used. The cost of participation in the Model Event is **25 PLN** per person. Entries are to be made until **20.07.2026** via Polish Orienteering Association entry system:

3rd stage in KM21E classes will be a World Ranking Event race. KM21E competitors who want to be classified within the WRE during this stage, in addition to submitting the standard registration via the Polish Orienteering Association system, must also register for this race via IOF Eventor by 20.07.2026:

Punching system

SPORTident system will be used for punching during the event. The stations will operate in AIR+ mode.

It is possible to rent a SPORTident card from the organizer for 5 PLN / stage. Please submit your request by e-mail (sudety@sudetycup.pl) by 20.07.2026 and make payment for the SPORTident card rental by bank transfer together with the entry fee payment.

Environment sustainability

Respecting the surrounding nature is extremely important, therefore during the competition we will try to reduce the negative impact of our event on the environment as much as possible - we will replace plastic with paper products where possible. You can also help us with this - bring your own reusable cups for water at the finish line.

As part of the stage classification, winners of stages 1-3 of all classes will receive special awards. After stage 3 we will also award World Ranking Event TOP3 athletes in KM21E classes.

Prize

WMOC 2026

In 2026, Poland hosts the World Masters Orienteering Championships (WMOC) which will take place in Rzeszów from August 7-14. Sudety Cup is an excellent opportunity to prepare for this major event! The 2026 edition will be held one week before the championships and the maps for Sudety Cup were prepared by the WMOC cartographers.

Additionally, immediately following Sudety Cup - from Monday to Wednesday - we are organizing a series of training sessions (sprint and forest) held in the vicinity of Sudety Cup competition areas. These sessions will be a great opportunity for final preparations and fine-tuning before the WMOC. Detailed information will be available in March 2026 at sudetycup.pl.

JWOC 2027

For the fourth time in history, Poland has been selected to host the Junior World Orienteering Championships (JWOC). The last JWOC held in Poland took place in Wejherowo in 2011. This time, competitors will visit the south of the country - Polanica-Zdrój will serve as the host city and all races will take place not further than 30 kilometers from there.

Sudety Cup is a perfect opportunity to prepare for the championships. The 2026 edition will take place in areas directly adjacent to the terrain planned for JWOC 2027. Additionally, immediately following Sudety Cup - from Monday to Wednesday - the first official JWOC 2027 training camp will be held. Its main goal is to allow participants to get familiar with the terrain, gain valuable experience, and better prepare for world-class competition. More information is available at jwoc2027.pl.

Climate

Temperature for July in Lasówka vary between 10 and 24 $^{\circ}$ C with an average of 15 $^{\circ}$ C. Average rainfall for July is 110 mm with 15 rainy days during a month. The weather can be anything from warm and sunny to windy and rainy. Please take into account that the race will be held between 700 and 900 m a. s. l., so the weather conditions at start and finish can differ a lot and change rapidly.
